

Statement regarding the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Hazard Communication Standard and Safety Data Sheets (SDS)

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Hazard Communication Standard found at 29 CFR 1910.1200 requires that chemical manufacturers and importers prepare Safety Data Sheets (SDS) describing the health and physical hazards of chemicals they produce or import.

The Hazard Communication Standard and the requirements to prepare SDSs are not applicable to "articles". An article is defined in the regulation as a "manufactured item other than a fluid or particles: (I) which is formed to a specific shape or design during manufacture; (II) which has end use function(s) dependent in whole or in part upon its shape or design during end use; and (111) which under normal conditions of use does not release more than very small quantities, e.g., minute or trace amounts of a hazardous chemical and does not pose a physical hazard or health risk to employees".
